

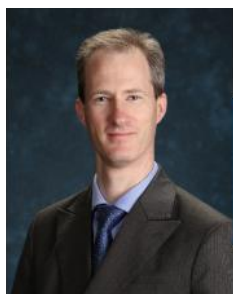

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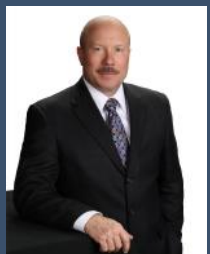

As you know, the Board canceled the Membership vote for the capital assessment that was to be held on July 25th. The other part is, the Board has tied the land sale to the project, meaning no work will begin on the course renovation until the sale of the land has closed.

To update everyone on where we are at with the sale of the land; the buyer is in the final stages of creating the site plan. Once the site plan is complete, it will go before the Elkhart County Zoning Commission for approval. After approval, we will complete the sale, per the existing contract.

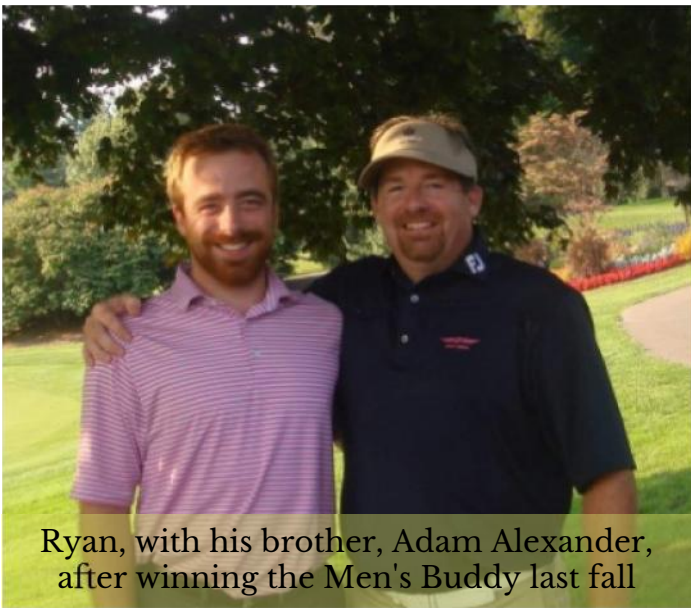

The family loves playing games – the boys especially like Monopoly with their dad, card games, explor-



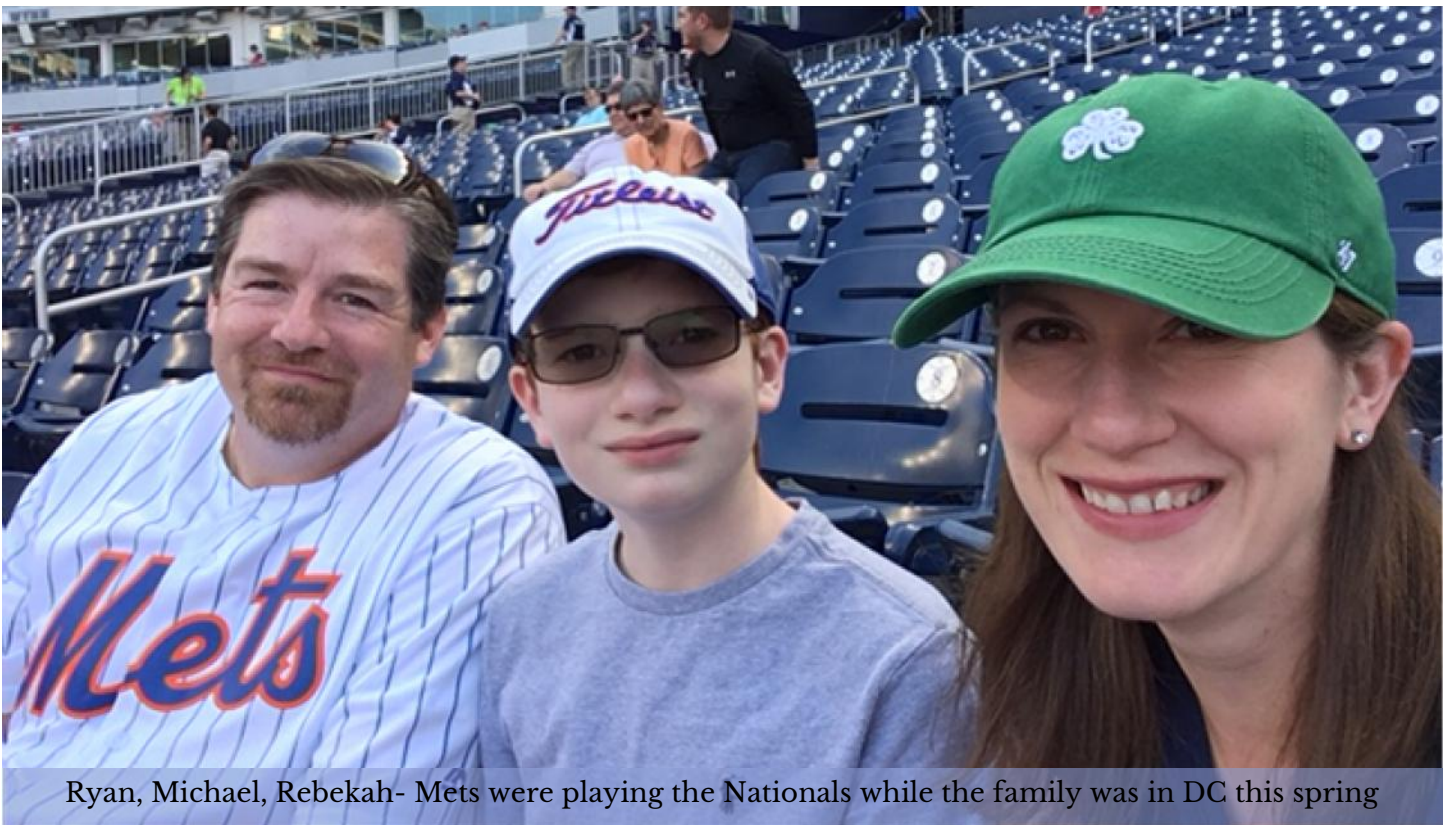

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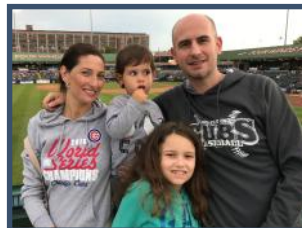

The golf course has made it through the first part of the summer in great condition. The weather, outside of a few hot humid days here and there, has been pretty normal so far. But we have much more summer to go. I would like to remind everyone that

Lastly, I wanted to remind everyone that we are about a month away from starting our fall aerification schedule. We have moved the schedule around a bit to provide better playing conditions through the busy month of September. Tees will be aerified on September 5th, and green surrounds will be solid tined throughout September when the schedule and labor allows. Greens will be aerified October 5th and 6th following the Hole-in-One Stag. Finally, fairways will be aerified the week of October 9th. These dates are, of course, dependent on the weather, and I will communicate any necessary changes. Have

during hot, humid afternoons, our staff may be out a great month and I will see you out on the golf syringing greens. This temporary cooling of the turf course!

is vital towards the survival of the plant through the hot weather. If you see one of our staff syringing a green as you approach your ball, please hold off on playing your approach shot until they have cleared the green.

The staff is currently working on replacing bunker sand on hole numbers 3 and 7 greenside bunkers. This annual process in a couple bunkers provides fresh sand, while giving us other sand to top off a couple fairway bunkers. For a more in depth look at this

The inspiration the kitchen staff receives from the varieties of produce grown is endless. Allowing members to experience real home-grown produce is a gift the kitchen staff can give.

Hello to all Members. The past two months at the Club have been great. The Fourth of July was a great day as well as the whole week of Men's Invitational. We tried some new things in the Clubroom including Music on The Terrace. The turnout for this was great and we will do this again next season during the summer weeks.

There are a few new wines in the Clubroom that I think everyone will enjoy. We have added two new Chardonnays and a Red Blend to our list. Both of the Chardonnays can be ordered by the glass or bottle and the Red Blend by the bottle.

Roberts Mondavi The Bourbon Barrel-Aged Chardonnay is rich golden in color and opens with intense aromas of ripe pineapple and toasted coconut with hints of toasted marshmallow and vanilla bean. Flavors of grilled pineapple, juicy peach, graham cracker and toffee follow, with baking spices and toasty oak. This rich, creamy, and concentrated wine has balanced acidity and a lingering finish that makes it perfect to enjoy on its own or with a variety of foods. This is the first ever Chardonnay to blend the craftsmanship of California winemaking with the Southern tradition of Bourbon Whiskey aging.

2012 Russian River Valley Reserve Chardonnay has a light straw color with a golden edge, offers forward fruit with minerality, lifted and framed by sweet oak notes and spice. This wine reflects the best of what Russian River Valley fruit can offer: rich, complex wines with depth and agility. Their vibrancy and freshness wake up the palate. On the nose, look for orange blossoms, sweet toasty notes, and hints of smoke with lemon curd, tart apple, tangerine, cream, and hints of buttery caramel and baking spice. Mineral notes highlight green apple freshness. Flavors include bright fresh fruit like pineapple, lemon zest, tangerine, and Granny Smith apple. Nicely spiced on the palate with hints of nutmeg and cinnamon, this wine

is rich, creamy and full of flavor with structure and a lifted tropical finish.

Cooper & Thief Cellarmasters Bourbon Barrel Aged Red Wine Blend 2014 is a dark and jammy red wine blend loaded with bourbon-inspired flavors and aromas. Crafted by Cellarmaster, Jeff Kasavan, this wine is aged for three months in bourbon barrels, which gives way to soft, velvety tannins with a subtle heat. The combined result is a rich flavor, with a long, lingering finish. The varietal composition for this wine is: 38% Merlot / 37% Syrah / 11% Zinfandel / 7% Petite Sirah / 4% Cabernet Sauvignon / 3% Other Red Blenders.

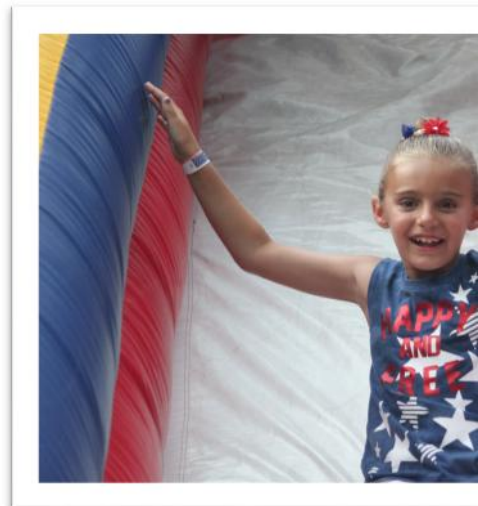
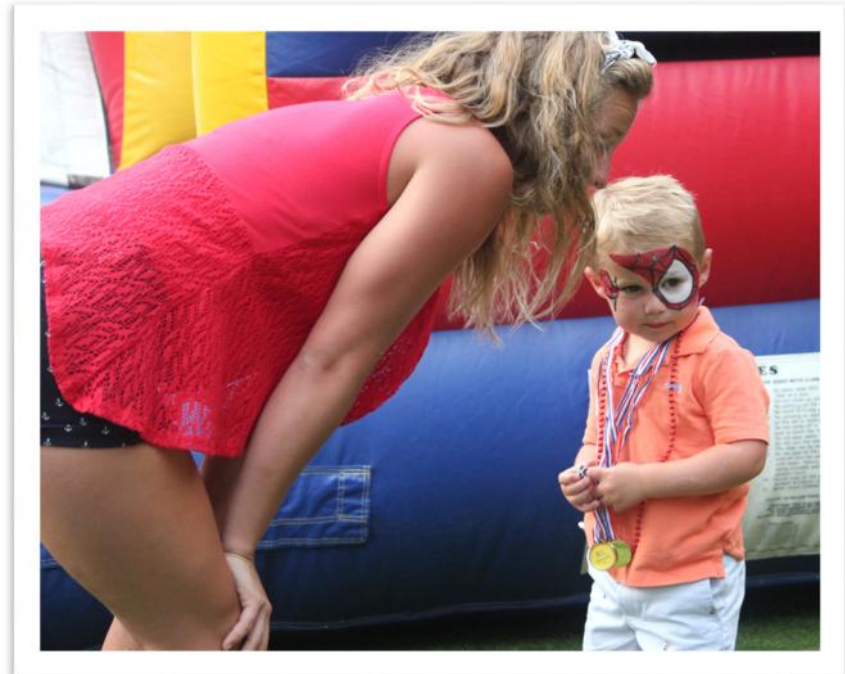
